Founded in 1985 by the Congregation of Benedictine Sisters, this policy institute is committed to improving policies that better the economic and health and social conditions for low-moderate income Texans. CPPP is home to KIDS COUNT and TEXAS VOICE FOR HEALTH REFORM. An Honors graduate from the University of Texas School of Law, Scott McCown has been named one of "The 25 Most Powerful People in Texas Politics," a "voice for the voiceless" and "the conscience of Texas politics" by Texas Monthly. He is an elected member of the American Law Institute and continues to bring his noteworthy leadership to advance health and social conditions in Texas.
